IT

1) Sita speaks ^v ^{↗ adverb.} slowly.

2) The bell rang ^v ^{↗ adverbs} loudly.

Verbs can be used in Reciprocation

1. IT verbs. → T verbs by adding a preposition to them.

(a) He looks $\xrightarrow{P^V}$ after $\xrightarrow{P^P}$ his parents. $\xrightarrow{P^D}$

(b) They laughed \xrightarrow{V} at $\xrightarrow{P^P}$ me.

IT Cognate objects

(a) He sighed $\xrightarrow{P^V}$ | a deep $\xrightarrow{P^O}$ sigh. \xrightarrow{CO}

IT (b) Our army $\xrightarrow{P^V}$ fought | a fierce $\xrightarrow{P^O}$ fight. \xrightarrow{CO}

Verbs used in a reflexive sense

1) The girl killed $\xrightarrow{P^V}$ herself.

2) The man enjoyed himself.

2) The man enjoyed himself.

- a) The tube burst. (itself)
- b) The girls made merry. (themselves)

Ditransitive Verbs

give, ask, tell, offer, promise, send

- (a) He gave me a pen.
- (b) Ram asked her a personal question.

Linking Verbs [Connects a subject to a subject complement]

- (a) The house is green.
 ↑
 linking verb ↗
 subject complement
- (b) The house was white, until we painted it.
 ↓ ↪
 to ↳
 subject complement

(P) verb must have one verb, which is present.
↓ ↓ ↘

To Raise → T.V

1) The govt. is raising taxes.

To Rise — IT.V

1) The sun is rising in the east.

To Set — T.V

1) He is setting a record.

To Sit — IT.V

1) He is sitting on the table.

2) I sat at my

shelf.

3) Have you set; the alarm for the morning?

Causative Verbs [action is being caused by someone else]

do, does, did

↳ Medals

can, could, may, might, shall, should,
used to, need, dare, ought to; will, would...

Inchoative Verb → beginning, development,
final stage
