

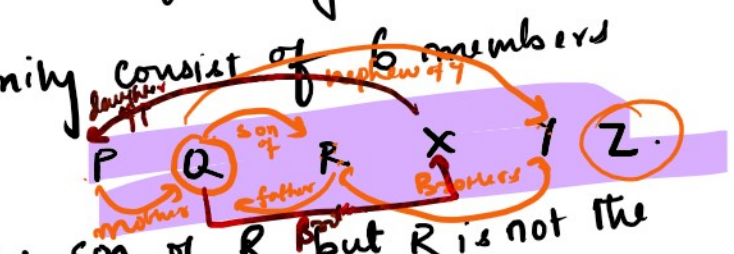
Blood Relation
