

1) ss, o, x, z, sh, ch,

es at the end. [not s] x

E.g - go → goes

pass → passes

mix → mixes

2) future, → Simple Present tense. + [if, till, as,

↓  
main verb

{ as soon as, when,  
unless, before, until,  
even if, in case, ]

E.g. - We shall wait till she arrives.

I shall not go there even if [it rains.]

3) We are seeing with our eyes. - No Present Continuous form allowed  
 We see with our eyes.

Simple Present (✓)



- Verbs of Perception (feel, hear, smell...)
- Verbs of Cognition (believe, know, think...)
- Verbs of Emotion (hope, love, hate, ...)

E.g. Are you hearing a strange noise? → (X)

Do you hear a strange noise? → (✓)

4) Adverbs - 'yesterday', 'last year', 'last month',  
 'ago', 'short while ago', ✓

E.g. He has completed his book yesterday. → (X)

He completed his book yesterday - (✓)

→ Present Perfect

E.g. - They have gone there a short while ago. → (X)

They went there a short while ago - (✓)

They went there a short while ago -  X

5) 'For' is used for period of time.

'since' is used - for point of time.

Morning, evening → since.

sometime, hours, months, ~~a week~~ → for

E.g. We have been doing this project for a week now.

She has been playing since 7 p.m.

6) He switched on the light before he opened the door.

[when sequence of activities take

['before' should be present place in the sentence]  
in the simple past

E.g. The train started just before I reached the station.

↳ simple past

→ simple past

→ The use of Simple Past Tense with 'any kind of wish' and 'if only' shows unreal past and present state of things.

E.g. I wish I were a millionaire.

If only I knew him.  
                            ↑ S. Past

\* Principal clause is in Past Tense, the subordinate clause will also be in Past Tense.  
                            → Simple Past

E.g. My father assured me that he  
        ↑ Simple Past would buy me a bike.

He failed because he did not work hard.  
                            ↑ S. Past                      → Simple Past

Exceptions:

E.g. He said that the Earth revolves around

the Sun.  
Simple past

We learnt at school that truth always wins.

[mathematical calculation, universal truth, historical fact, moral guidelines, habitual fact,

8) more than → conjunction of comparison.

E.g. He loved me more than he loved you. ✓

He loved me more than he loves you ✓

He loved me more than he will love you ✓

✓ where → adjective.

E.g. I visited the place where the accident happened.

I visited the village where he lives.  
↳ S.Past                                    ↳ S.Present

I visited the village where she will

I visited the village where she will stay.  
↳ s. Past

9) When is usually used when one action is completed and another action is going on.

While is used when two actions are going on at a time.

E.g :- When he arrived, his wife was washing her clothes.

While Namita was cooking, I was washing clothes.

10) Past Perfect is used when we look back on earlier action from a certain point in the past.

→ Past Perfect

E.g I had just poured myself a glass of milk when the phone rang. - s. Past.

E.g . She had completed <sup>Past Perfect</sup> her work, before

Eg : One had completed new work, before  
I reached there.

↳ S. Past

1) [The students will have left the  
class] before the teacher comes. → S: Present  
→ Future Perfect

The principal will have started the speech  
before I reach there.  
↳ S. Present
