Rahul told me that I was a good boy.

2. She said, "The cat was running and the dog was chasing it." <sup>past cont.</sup>

[tense will not change]

She said that the cat was running and the dog was chasing it.

3. She said, "I worked in Delhi for two years." <sup>past</sup> [tense won't change]  
period/time

She said that she worked in Delhi for two years.

4. Robert said "I must go now"

4. Robert said, "I must go now."

Robert said that he had to go then.

Robert said, "I need not go."

Robert said that he will not have to go.

5. He said, "I must finish this book on Monday." <sup>past</sup>

He said that he would have to finish that book on Monday.

6. He said, "I need not write this essay." <sup>past</sup>

He said that he would not have to write that essay.

Must → command / compulsion.

7. The policeman said to us, "You must not cross

7. The policeman said to us, "You must not cross the road against the red light."

The policeman told us that we must not cross the road against the red light.

8. Interrogative means questions.

✓ Q = (D) said

Q = (I) = asked / enquired / demanded

helping verbs.

12. He <sup>✓ past</sup> said to me, " what are you doing ? "

He asked me what I was doing.

13. The master said to the servant, " Post the letter at once ."

The master ordered the servant to post the letter at once.

14. I <sup>✓ past</sup> said to my son, " Work hard for a brother ."

" - some day soon, work harder for a  
better tomorrow."

I advised my son to work hard for a  
better tomorrow.

(I) wished =

- (D) said [ Goodbye, good-night, farewell )  
(I) bade

- (D) May I ... / May God ...  
(I) wished / prayed.

- (D) said  
(I) exclaimed joyfully . . .

- (D) sorrow, grief, pain.

Alas !

Alas !

(I) exclaimed with grief, sorrow, pain.

(D) Praise, Congratulations.

(I) applauded

(P) He said to me, "Good morning."

(J) He wished me good morning.

(D) The boy said, "If I could win this game."

(I) The boy wished that he could win that game.

(D) She said <sup>past</sup> to him, " May <sup>present</sup> God grant you success in the examination."

(I) She prayed that God might <sup>past</sup> grant him success in the examination.
